To build a social service sector that is highly accountable, efficient, effective and responsive to social needs, upholding the long-term sustainable development of society and the well-being of our citizens.


Our Mission

Hong Kong Government & NGOs

HK Government adopts a "small government, big society" approach in social service provision – most social welfare services are provided by NGOs

Government:

- Policy formulation
- Service planning and development
- Provide funding for social service
- Monitor NGOs' performance
- Provide part of welfare services (social protection and emergency relief)

NGOs:

- Provide quality subsidized services according to government, and develop other resources to provide nonsubsidized services
- Assist in policy formulation and services planning
- Conduct feedback on service and stakeholders' needs through different exchange platforms



- organizations have their own unique background and missions.


Expanding NGO Sector

- 52.7% Members are Small and Medium Sized NGOs.
- 68.7% of members are not receiving subvention from SWD.
- Total expenditure of HK\$23.87billion (a year) was recorded.




Legal Forms of NGOs in HK


Local NGOs are usually formed as:

- a company incorporated under the Companies Ordinance (limited by guarantee or by share);
- a society established under the Societies Ordinance;
- a trust;
- a statutory body established by the Hong Kong legislature




 80% Agency Members are registered under Companies Ordinance.




Governance Structure of NGOs
