



New CPD Requirements Information Session



The Institute issued a revised Statement 1.500 (August 2005), which prescribes new CPD requirements as from 1 December 2005. Under the new requirements, all members are required to complete a minimum of 120 hours of relevant professional development activity in each rolling three-year period, of which 60 hours should be verifiable. A minimum of 20 hours of the above 120 hours should be completed each year.
